**Subject:** Rescission of Superseded Policies in Human Resources

**Background:** On May 8, 2014, by Minute Order #32-14(c), the TSTC Board of Regents

approved the concept and implementation of a single accreditation for the Texas State Technical College System effectively merging its four colleges into a single entity. This effort has come to be called "Single Accreditation" or abbreviated as "SA." Single Accreditation requires that TSTC migrate some of its heretofore local and often dissimilar practices to a unified statewide level.

This minute order effects such a change.

Periodically, Board policies are reviewed and replacement policies are

recommended to the Board. The Minute Order listed below was superseded by a new statewide policy that was approved at the November 2015 meeting.


